Four New Full Scholarships for Outstanding Mannheim MBA Students and Four New Partner Universities in Asia and Northern America

- Mannheim Business School is offering one outstanding scholar from each of Asia, Latin America, East Europe and Germany the course fees for the 'European MBA'
- All applications received before 19th March 2007 will be considered
- New renowned partner universities in Asia and North America
- 'Information Session' for the 'European MBA' on 10th and 24th February 2007 in Mannheim

With four new full scholarships and a range of partial scholarships, the Mannheim Business School will support excellent participants of its twelve-month full-time program 'The European MBA'. One scholar from each of Asia, Latin America, Eastern Europe and Germany will have the fees of 21,800 Euros waived completely for the sixth class of the management course, which starts in September 2007. A total of 100,000 Euro is available.

In addition to that, outstanding students of the new class of the 'European MBA' will have the opportunity to complete one of their two three-month foreign stays at a renowned business school outside Europe. They can choose between

- the Queen's School of Business in the Canadian city of Kingston,
- Thunderbird - The Garvin School of International Management in Glendale (Arizona/USA),



- the CEIBS (China Europe International Business School) in Shanghai and
- the Indian Institute of Technology in India's Madras (IIM).

They complement the circle of European partner universities, which has included the French elite business school ESSEC in Cergy Pontoise near Paris and the British Warwick Business School in Coventry since the start of the course, the Danish Copenhagen Business School (since 2005) and the EADA in Barcelona (since 2006).

Prospective students can only benefit from the new scholarships and partner universities when they have submitted their complete application by 19th March 2007.

The chance to form an image of the Mannheim Business School and the 'European MBA' in advance is offered by 'Information Sessions' on 10th and 24th February at 11 am. Prior registration for one of those events is obligatory.
